Measuring Tips

Remember you, the customer, assume the responsibility for the dimensions you provide. Final field measurements should be completed by your contractor or in staller and reviewed by you before placing the cabinetry order.

FLOORPLAN INFORMATION

Begin by drawing the shape of your room. Add doors, windows, breaks in the wall and all obstructions. Indicate in which directions doors swing and where they lead.

Indicate the overall length and height of walls. For new construction, remember to take into consideration sheetrock thickness.

Include dimensions of islands or peninsulas.

WINDOW AND DOOR DIMENSIONS

Measure the dimensions of all the doors and windows in the room.

Always measure to and from the outside of all casings, moldings and trims.

Measure the distance above the door or window to the ceiling.







